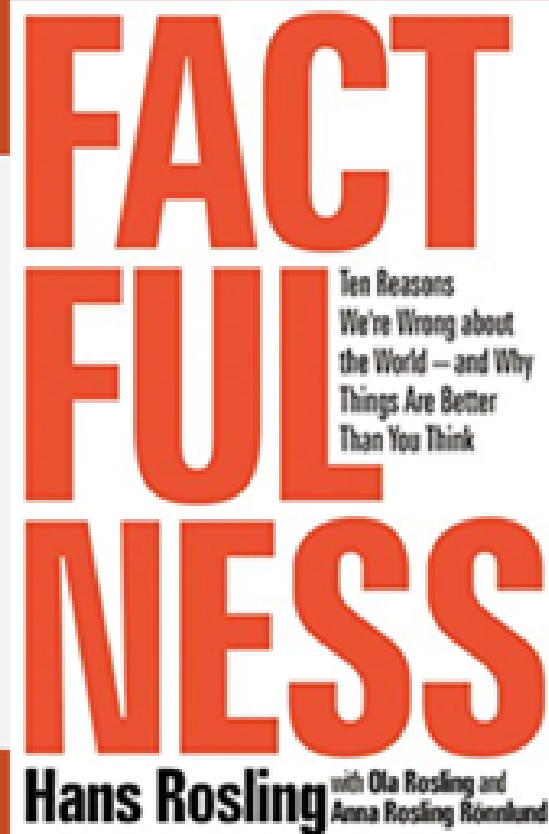

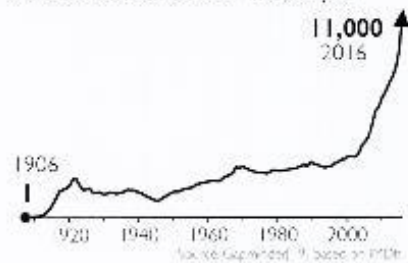

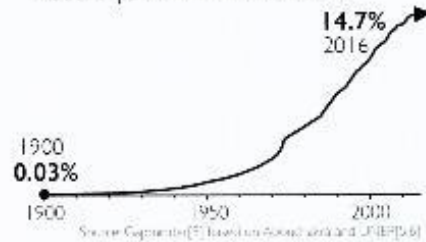

Share of Earth's land surface protected as national parks and other reserves



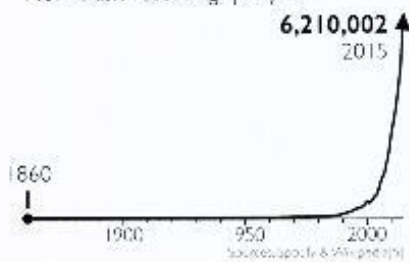
WOMEN'S RIGHT TO VOTE

Countries with equal rights for women and men to vote (out of 194)



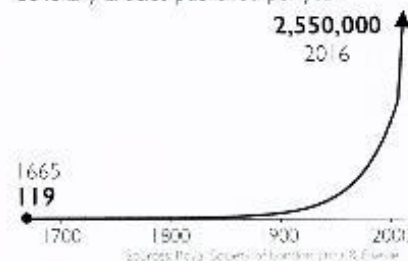

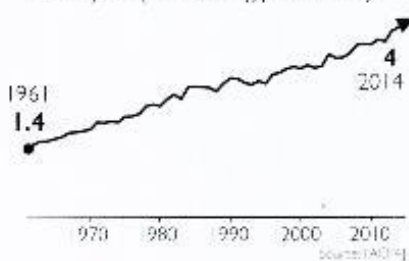

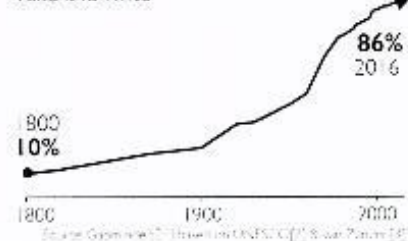

Cereal yield (thousand kg per hectare)



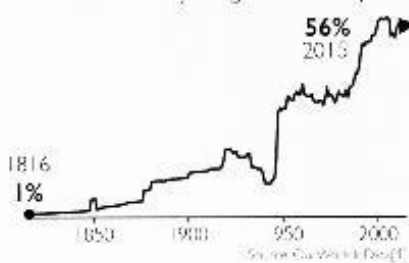

Share of adults (15+) with basic skills to read and write



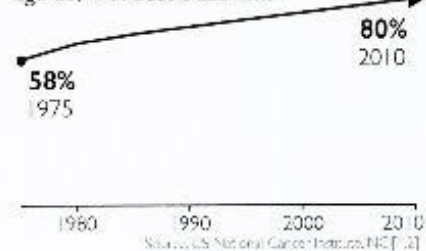

Share of humanity living in democracy



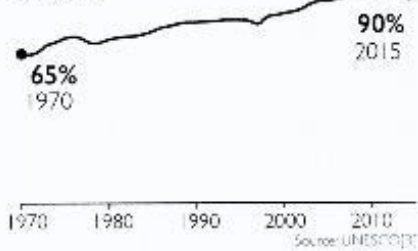
CHILD CANCER SURVIVAL

5 year survival of those diagnosed before age 20, with best treatment



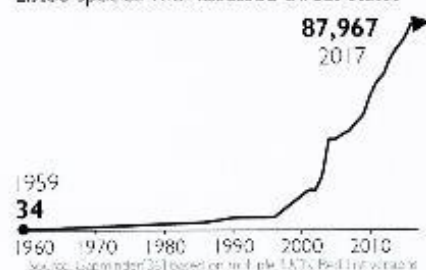
GIRLS IN SCHOOL

Share of girls of primary school age enrolled



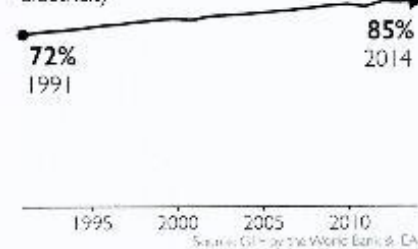
MONITORED SPECIES

Listed species with assessed threat status



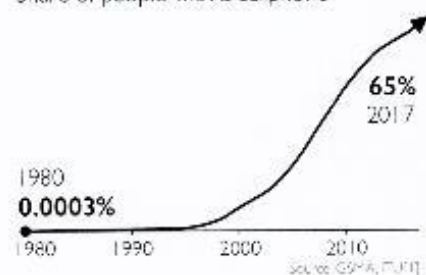
ELECTRICITY COVERAGE

Share of people with some access to electricity



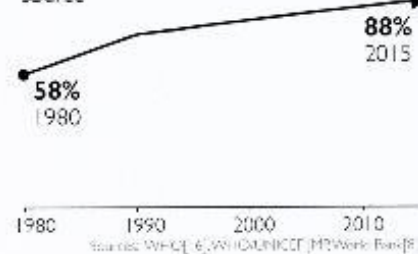
MOBILE PHONES

Share of people with a cellphone



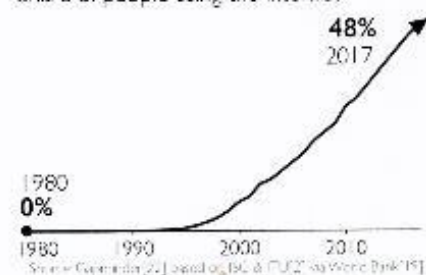
WATER

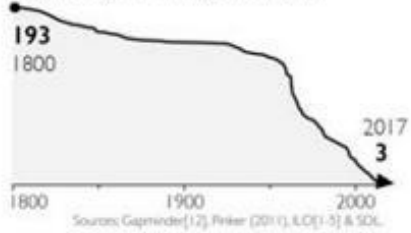
Share of 1-year olds who got at least one vaccination

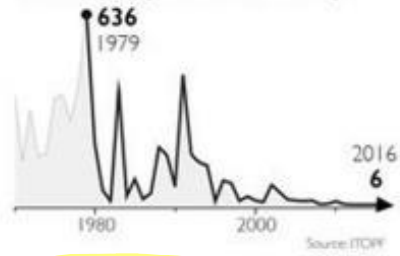

Countries where forced labor is legal or practiced by the state (out of 194)



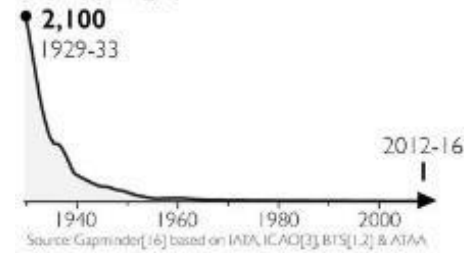
OIL SPILLS

1,000 tons oil spilled from tanker ships



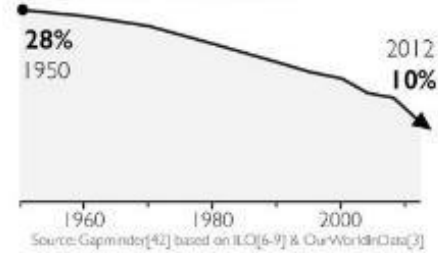
PLANE CRASH DEATHS

Deaths per 10 billion passenger miles (5-year averages)



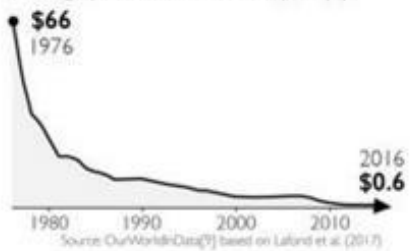
CHILD LABOR

Share of children aged 5-14 who work full time under bad conditions



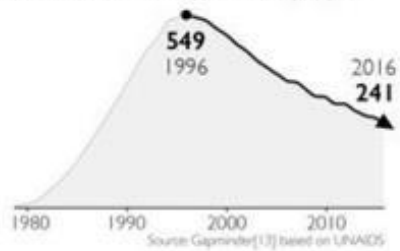
EXPENSIVE SOLAR PANELS

Average price of PV modules (\$/Wp)



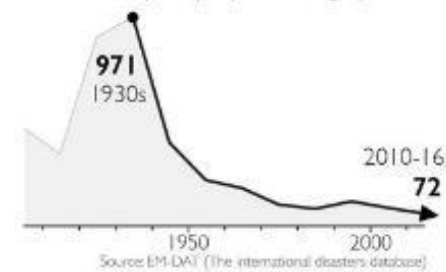
HIV INFECTIONS

New HIV infections per million people



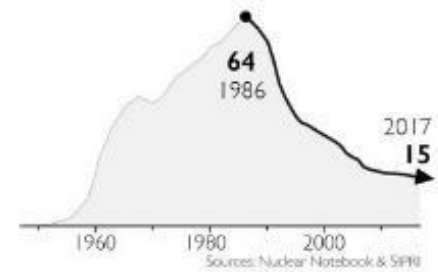

1,000 deaths/year (10-year averages)



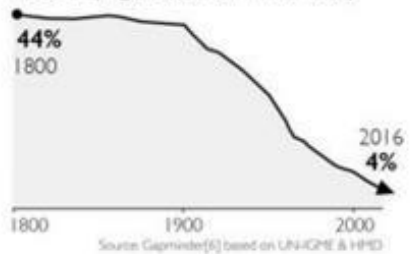
NUCLEAR ARMS

1,000s of nuclear warheads



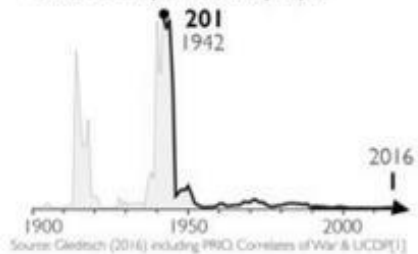
CHILDREN DYING

Percent dying before their fifth birthday



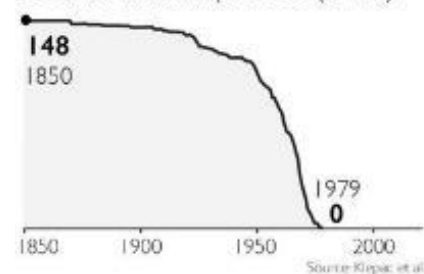
BATTLE DEATHS

Battle deaths per 100,000 people



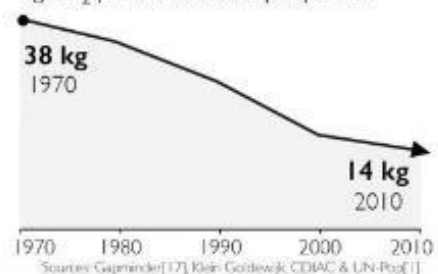
SMALLPOX

Countries with smallpox cases (of 194)



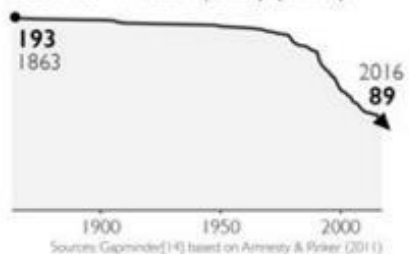
SMOKE PARTICLES

Kg SO₂ particles emitted per person



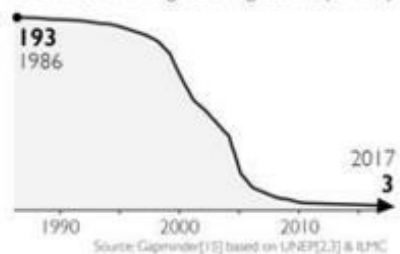
DEATH PENALTY

Countries with death penalty (of 194)



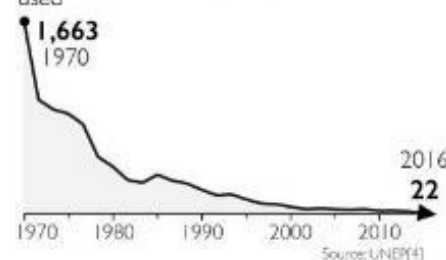
LEADED GASOLINE

Countries allowing lead in gasoline (of 194)



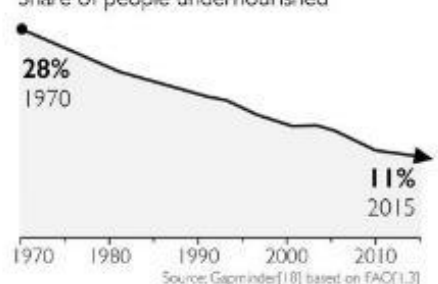
OZONE DEPLETION

1,000 tons ozone-depleting substances used

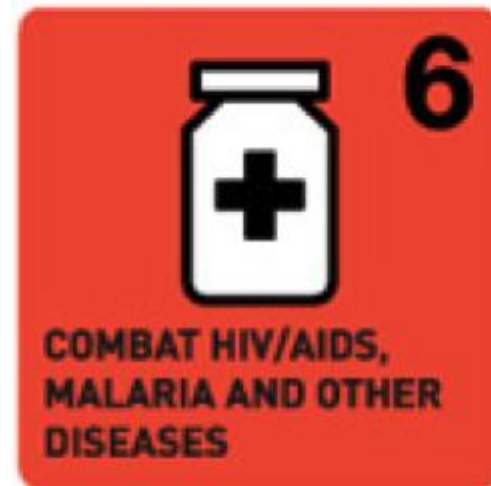

Share of people undernourished

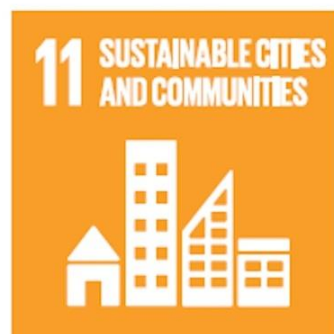
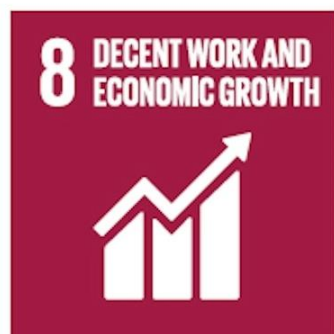

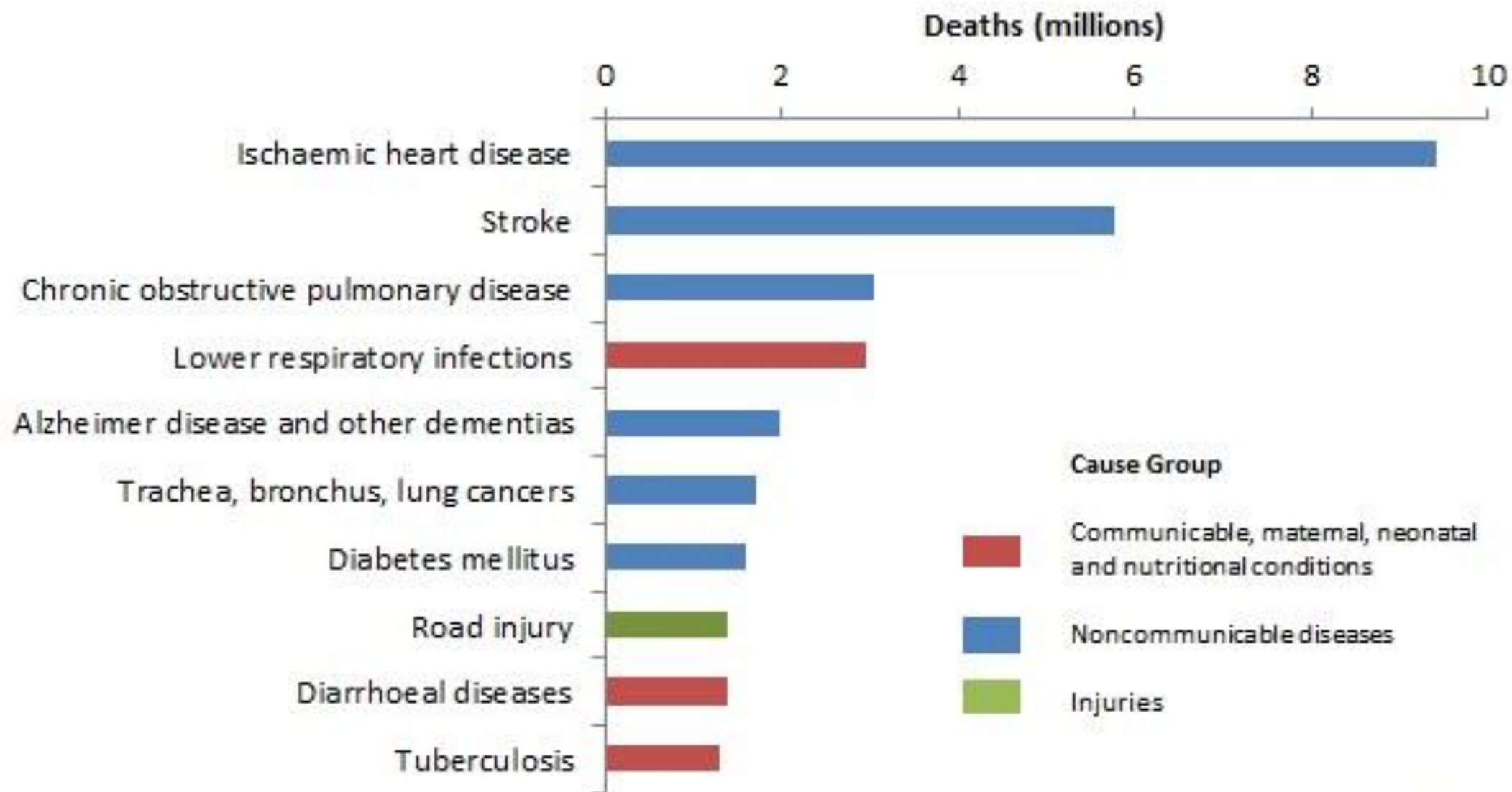

Top 10 global causes of deaths, 2016

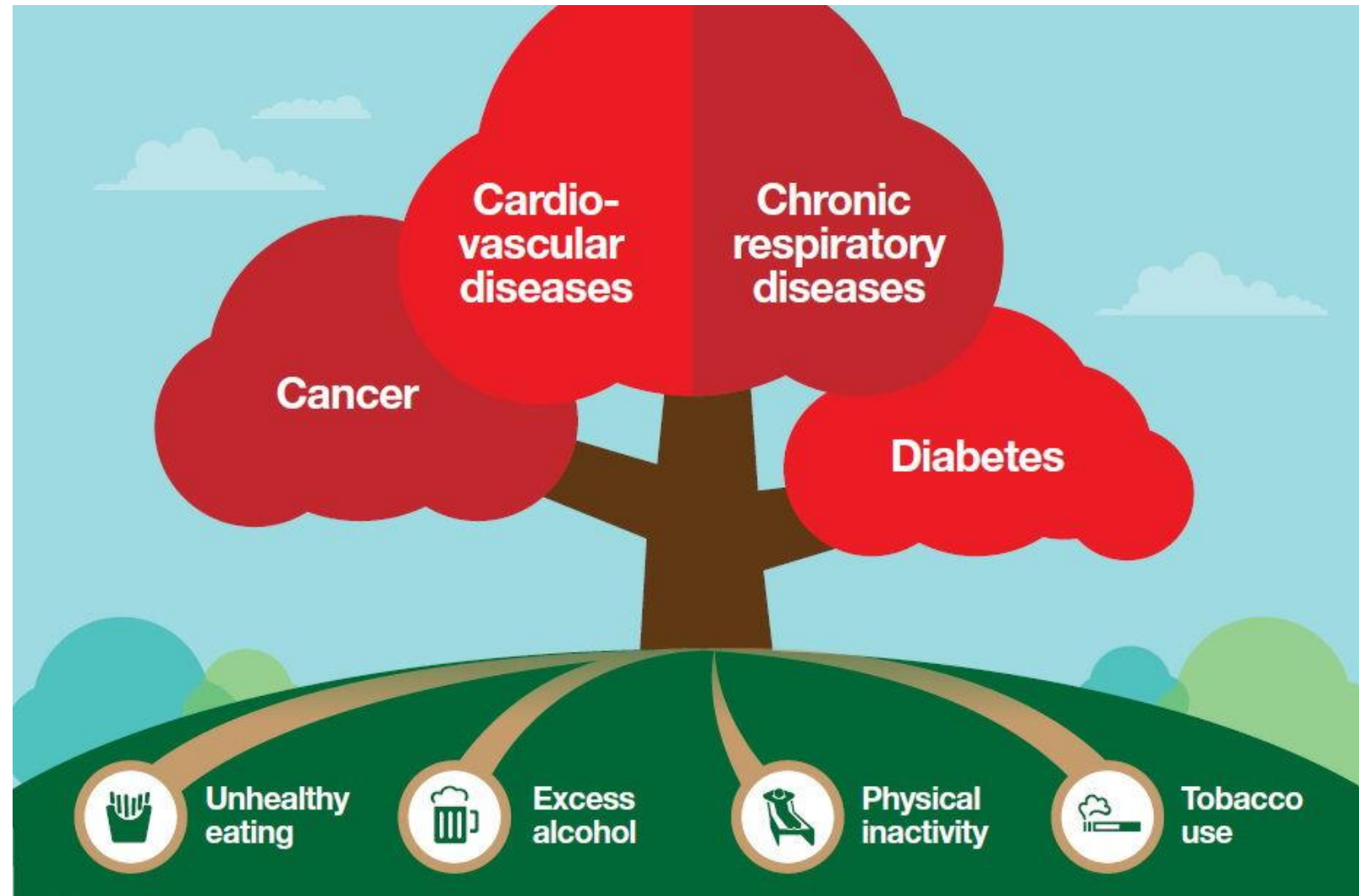

NCDs are the world's number one killer, causing 70% of all deaths globally

Noncommunicable diseases, such as diabetes, cancer and heart disease, are collectively responsible for over 70% of all deaths worldwide, or 41 million people. This includes 15 million people dying prematurely, aged between 30 and 69.

Over 85% of these premature deaths are in low- and middle-income countries. The rise of these diseases has been driven by five major risk factors: tobacco use, physical inactivity, the harmful use of alcohol, unhealthy diets and air pollution.

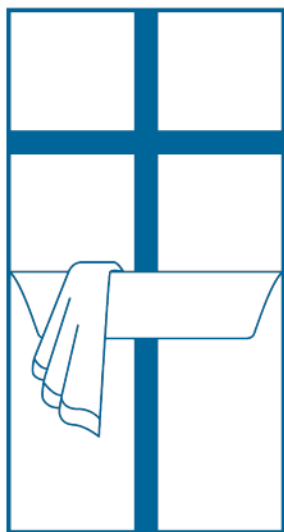


Visão e Missão

Visão: Um testemunho Cristão através de médicos e dentistas em todas as comunidades e em todas as nações.

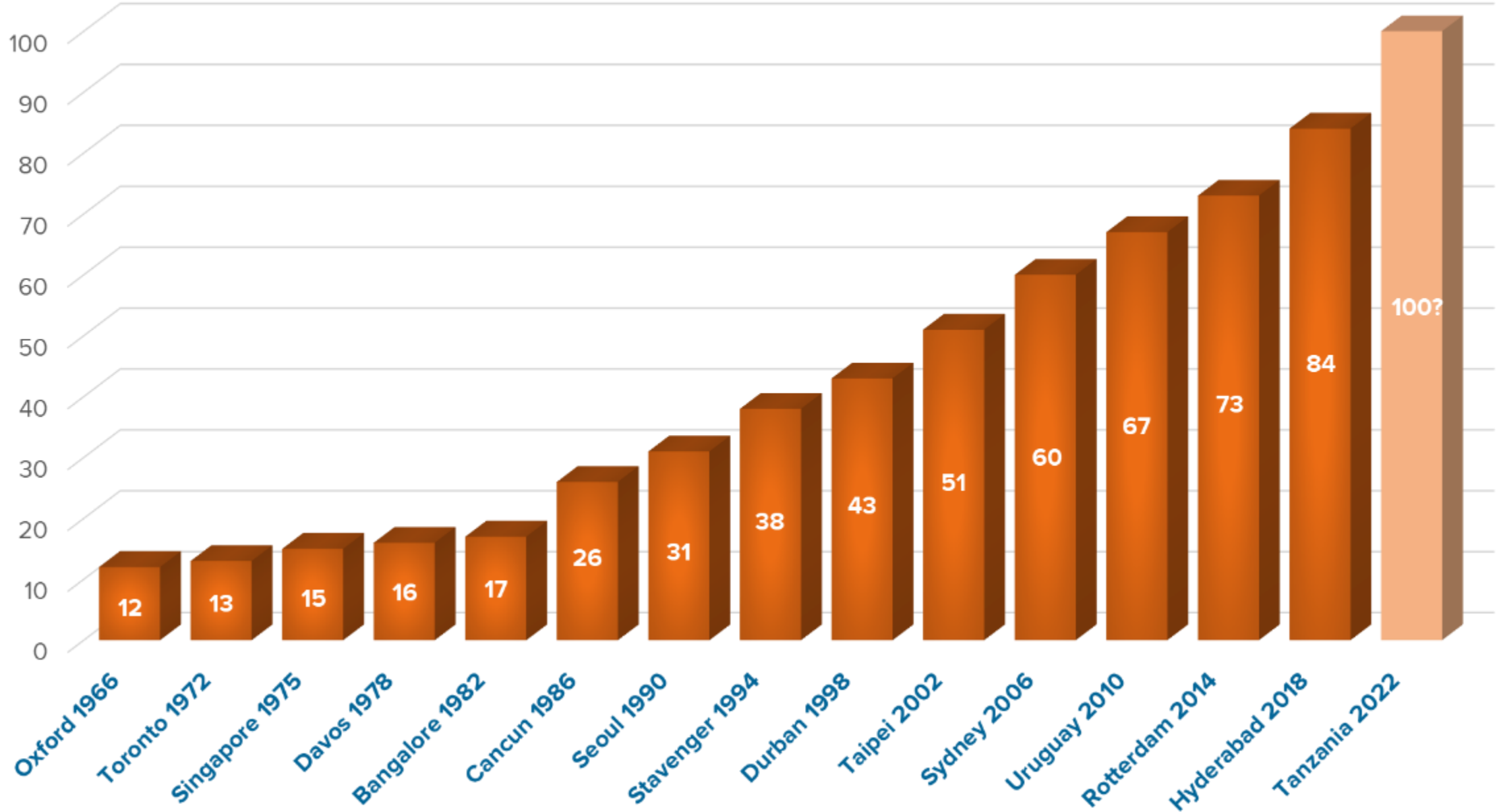

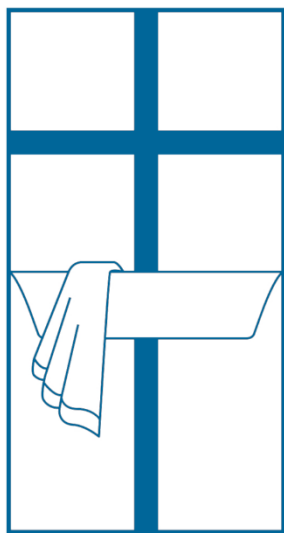
Os pontos fortes do ICMDA

Atenção Primária à Saúde

- Metade dos 7,3 bilhões de pessoas no mundo ainda não tem acesso a serviços essenciais de saúde.
- A cada ano, cerca de 100 milhões são levados à pobreza porque precisam pagar pelos cuidados com a saúde do próprio bolso.
- 80-90% das necessidades de saúde das pessoas ao longo da vida podem ser cobertas pela atenção primária à saúde. Um bom atendimento primário de saúde leva a melhores resultados de saúde, melhor qualidade de atendimento e maior expectativa de vida.
- Os cuidados de saúde primários são cuidados de alta qualidade, centrados nas pessoas e acessíveis em todas as fases da sua vida

The International Postgraduate Diploma in Family Medicine (IDFM) aims to train and certify doctors with postgraduate training in family medicine in the developing world and equip them professionally and spiritually to serve their country and the poor.

The IDFM is an accredited distance education initiative by ICMDA, the Distance Education Unit of Christian Medical College (CMC), Vellore, India, and Loma Linda University (LLU), USA.

The two year blended learning curriculum is designed to hone distinct family physician attitudes, skills and knowledge that qualify the physician to provide continuing, comprehensive medical and preventive care to families and the communities. The '*refer less, resolve more*' motto of the course, sharing historical roots to family practice is a step towards a cost effective, patient centered, problem oriented, evidence based, global health care delivery system.
